¹ Any combination of accreditations and assessments offered by IOAS (IFOAM Norms, ISO/IEC 65, EU Recognition Programme, Canadian Organic Regime, GOTS) and Organic Exchange(OE) is possible and in any order. Each programme is handled as a separate accreditation. An exception is where a CB already has accreditation to GOTS or OE and is adding the other in which case all fees in the additional accreditation column will be halved.

² For policy and procedure on adding accreditations when already accredited, please see IOAS procedure PR0509.

³ For addition of a single accreditation out of sequence with existing accreditation an additional fee of \$1000 is applicable. This fee will not apply where more than one additional accreditations are added simultaneously.

⁴ Standards screening is needed in the case of IFOAM accreditation unless using an IFOAM approved standard. Under the EU Recognition Programme, CBs using the ACB Equivalent EU Organic Production & Processing Standards for Third Countries, the standards screening has already been done.

⁵ In cases where more than one standard scope is required for ISO65 accreditation, the IOAS may apply an extra fee also to be agreed on a case by case basis depending on the nature of the standard..

⁶ For accreditation to GOTS a technical expert will assist at the site visit which will result in some additional days plus additional travel costs and accommodation which will be agreed before the visit.

⁸ These fees are not paid during the year of re-evaluation. Visits usually occur twice in first 4 year cycle and once in subsequent cycles. In years with no visits (bye years) the report assessment fee is paid (See IOAS document PR0508 Surveillance procedures)

⁹ The savings with ongoing surveillance from multiple accreditation are dependent on the schedules for the different accreditations being harmonized.

¹⁰ Where less than annual on-site visits are permitted under rules of relevant programme.
